Learning English can be a very daunting and sometimes intimidating task for children who are adopted from foreign countries. My wife and I have adopted six precious children from Bogota, Colombia, who needed to learn English in order to live here in their new country. Since neither of us spoke Spanish, we were not able to bridge the language barrier ourselves so we turned to our friends at Project Light for help. In just a few days the team from Project Light had a computer up and running and the New Life Bibles waiting for our children to learn how to read. In 2005 we began using the Project Light system to tutor our first four children (then ages 10,8,6,5) so they would be prepared for entrance into the mainstream school. The system really works and the steady progression is just what they needed as ESL students. In just 6 months of using Project Light as our primary reading software, they were all able to enter school at their appropriate grade level. Shortly after this they started reading their New Life Bibles and all six of them have invited Jesus into their hearts to forgive their sins. We currently are using



Project Light with our 12 year old son who was adopted in 2007. He also reads and journals daily from the New Life Bible as he continues to expand his vocabulary through the Project Light stories on the computer. Our family has been very blessed by the ministry and people of Project Light and we appreciate the "can do" attitude exhibited by the staff and leaders of Project Light as they have worked with our family's unique learning situation. Learning Center Corner

A Story of Perseverance- Ocean View Baptist Church Learning Center in Norfolk, VA

Our center began as a vision of Mary Lou Roode, the Director of our Women’s Missionary Union. At the time, the church budget had no funds to establish such a project, so she and our pastor, Jim McLendon, prayed about it which resulted in a donation from a church member. The monies were sufficient to purchase the software and licensing, as well as the initial training. We were fortunate to already have a computer lab in the church which was used by the students in our Academy. Mary Lou and I attended the training at Project Light. Eagerly, we began our work! We trained tutors and devised student flyers in both English and Spanish to be distributed in neighborhoods and schools. The need for the program throughout the community was apparent, however, no students came. We prayed and wondered what we were doing wrong. My lesson in all of this was that God’s timing and my timing are not the same. He knows immeasurably more than I and knew what was coming down the pike for us. Shortly after our training, Mary Lou’s husband suffered a long session of bad health that required much care. Every tutor we trained had critical health issues and had to drop out of the program. My elderly mother also took a sharp decline in health. It was very difficult to devote the time it takes to grow a Learning Center. However, I stepped in as the Learning Center Director. One day I received a call from a young man from Ghana, Africa. He was eager to

learn. I immediately took him on as a student. He has been with us for quite some time now. Soon, the students starting coming at such a rate that I was concerned about finding enough tutors. We do not need to advertise, anymore. As each student came, a tutor from our church appeared. I trained each one and set him/her to work. Our pastor insisted that the tutors be members of our church since this was a church ministry. I wondered if we would ever get enough tutors from our congregation, but God has met the need.

We offer tutoring when the student is available. Four student/tutor teams come during the day and ten teams come two evenings a week. We have found that there is much support for each other in these larger gatherings. The students have gotten to know each other and even help with giving rides home when needed. They are all so eager to be there and to learn.

We now have three African students from Burkina Faso, Ghana, and Niger. Two of them are Muslim. One of the Muslim students is eager to learn about Jesus.

We have a student from Korea and a student from Burma is expecting to begin classes very soon. Our Vietnamese student is now working in another city, so we are praying to be able to work out a schedule that fits everyone.

We now have two literacy students, and even though they have reached middle age, they have not given up their dream to be able to read. Gregory’s biggest dream is to be able to read Scripture in his church. The other literacy student is the brother of one of our tutors. With one-on-one tutoring, each is progressing.

You can see that our center is now flourishing. God continues to provide and we continue to pray and work. This ministry has brought light into the lives of the students as well as the tutors. We are passionate about this program. We have learned to depend on God to provide. He is truly good!

Learning Centers Are Growing & Expanding!

Providence Presbyterian Church Learning Center in Virginia Beach, Virginia has been operating for over **9 years** using the Project Light software and has been working with the **BLS TutorSystems GED** software to supplement work for its students. It now will be expanding its **GED offering through BLS using the Internet**. Sandra Rushton, the Learning Center’s Director is excited to get students started on the Internet version of BLS TutorSystems GED software because of its increased capabilities. Students can now work from home as well!

Several Learning Centers around the U.S. integrate the BLS TutorSystems GED software in their already successful programs using Project Light.

Project Light’s comprehensive program takes a non-reader up to a fifth reading grade level. This fits perfectly with BLS TutorSystems program, which takes them to getting their high school diploma! Project Light is in partnership with BLS TutorSystems and is an authorized distributor of their CD and Internet programs.

UDM/UCCON Learning Center located in **Park Place** in Norfolk, VA offers adult GED classes during the school year and offers summer reading camps for children. This Center has been **operating for over 16 years**. **Learning Center Director Kerry Ann Sylvester** (who is a former student) oversees the program. This year 35 students were training to get their GED. They have served over 500 people since the Learning Center started!

Open Heart Ministries Learning Center in Lancaster, PA has decided to expand and in addition to offering literacy classes using Project Light literacy software, it will offer GED software in partnership with Project Light which is available over the Internet. Learning Center Director, **Marilyn Rodriguez** is eager to begin. Other Project Light Learning Centers that offer GED software in partnership with Project Light are **Fill My Cup Learning Center** located in **Charlotte, NC**, **Love Baptist Church Learning Center** located in **Phoenix, AZ**, **A Second Beginning Learning Center** located in **Dumas, Texas**, **Learning by Faith Learning Center** located in **Anniston, Alabama**, and **Riverchase UMC Learning and Training Center** located in **Birmingham, AL**.

Other noteworthy Learning Center expansions are **The Life Enrichment Center (LEC)**. In addition to **servng at Richard Bowling Elementary School** in Norfolk, Virginia, they are now expanding the Project Light program into **Jacox Elementary** and **Covenant Place**. The LEC has served 140 students since they started with Project Light at the end of 2004, including a few adult literacy students each year!
